New Heritage Murals Downtown Renfrew



Murals Outside of the Library

Two new heritage murals have been installed in the Town of Renfrew. The murals are located at the entrance to the Renfrew Public Library on Raglan Street South.

The mural on the right shows Raglan Street in 1937 with businesses such as Clemens's

Stores, Clark's Jewelers, Miller's Economy Store, McHail Hardware, Tip Top Tailors Men's Wear, Fraser & Smart Drugs and Reward Shoes.

The photo for the mural on the left was taken in 1907 and features the MacKay Bros. department store which later contained a restaurant and apartments. The business closed in 1913 and the building remains today at the corner of Raglan Street South

and Renfrew Avenue West.

Deadline for Grants to Community Partners Extended to September 15th, 2023

The Town of Renfrew is encouraging community partners to apply for grant funding. The application deadline for grants to community partners has been extended until 4:00 p.m. on Friday, September 15th, 2023.

Director of Library and Community Services Kelly Thompson says, "The Town of Renfrew is committed to supporting community partners who provide cultural, recreational, and social programs and services to residents."

Community partners can apply for a grant up to \$5,000. To qualify for a grant, applicants must be a not-for-profit organization operating in the Town of Renfrew, outline how their organization meets a need in the community, provide financial statements and annual project budgets, and demonstrate financial need for funding.

Community partner grants can be provided in the following categories:

- Fee Waiver/Facility Use
- One Time Capital Projects
- Organization Support/Operating Grant
- Programming/Special Event
- Sponsorship

Applicants will be evaluated for approval by a review team comprised of the

Mayor, members of Council, the CAO, Treasurer, and Director of Library and Community Services.

New Play Structure Coming to Ma-te-Way Park

Ma-te-Way Park is getting a new play structure. The current play structure will be closed for the coming weeks during the replacement process.

The Town of Renfrew received \$129,000 in grant funding through the Commemorate Canada – Reopening Fund to support the installation of the new play structure.

Mayor Tom Sidney says, "This is another great addition to Ma-te-Way Park and more families will be able to enjoy the new play structure that has accessible features for years to come."

The existing play structure at Ma-te-Way Park was closed to the public on August 10th, 2023, and the new equipment is expected to be fully installed and ready to use early in September.

All other amenities at Ma-te-Way Park including the Rotary Splash Pad, the natural playground next to the splash pad and the skate park will remain open during the construction of the new play structure.

Joffrey/Haig/Dufferin Road Construction



An update on the reconstruction of Joffre Avenue, Haig Avenue and Dufferin Street was provided during the Town of Renfrew Infrastructure, Public Works, and Asset Management Committee meeting on August 1st, 2023. Renfrew Town Council awarded the \$2.96-million contract for the project in August of 2022 and contractors started work on the three roads in May of 2023. Acting Director of Infrastructure and Public Works,

Connor Jamieson, says, "The project is on track to be completed by October 27th, 2023, and is currently on budget." The project includes storm sewer installation and watermain replacements with crews starting to prepare the road for paving and the installation of concrete curbs. Town of Renfrew Official Plan Review

The Town of Renfrew Official Plan is the primary policy document that guides growth and development within the Town and contains the goals, objectives and policies that direct future growth, along with policies related to the management of natural heritage features and natural hazard features. The current Official Plan was last reviewed in 2018 and another review is now required in accordance with the Planning Act.

Master Servicing Plan Review

The Town of Renfrew is seeking to better understand its existing potable water, stormwater, and wastewater system's conditions and to assess its ability to service future growth areas.

The Master Servicing Plan will review opportunities to optimize the performance of existing infrastructure, while developing a timeline for future expansion requirements to meet anticipated growth needs.

🕅 College Campus Fire Safety Tips

- Look for fully sprinklered housing when choosing a dorm or off-campus housing.
- Make sure you can hear the building alarm system when you are in your dorm room.
- Test all smoke alarms at least monthly.
- Never remove batteries or disable the alarm.
- Learn your building's evacuation plan and practice all drills as if they were the real thing.
- If you live off campus, have a fire escape plan with two ways out of every room.
- When the smoke alarm or fire alarm sounds, get out of the building quickly and stay out.
- Stay in the kitchen when cooking.
- Check your school's rules before using electrical appliances in your room.

Smoking Sense

If you smoke, smoke outside and only where it is permitted. Use sturdy, deep, non-tip ashtrays. Don't smoke in bed or when you've been drinking or are drowsy.

Fact

- Fires in dormitories are more common in the evening, between 5-11pm, and on weekends.
- Roughly five out of six fires in dormitories are started by cooking.
