#### Units Available for the Food Cycler Program

Using electricity, the Food Cycler device dries and grinds food waste into a dry, odorless, nutrient-dense by-product that is significantly reduced in weight and volume from its unprocessed state. Each "cycle" of composting takes approximately 4 to 8 hours.

Residents can choose between the 2.5L FC-30 model at a cost of \$175 + HST, or the larger 5L Maestro model at a cost of \$300 +HST. Residents are asked to track their usage of the Foodcycler during each



week of the 12-week pilot period. At the end of the 12 weeks, residents must report their usage and answer a survey. Participants must be residents of the Town of Renfrew.

## **Lochiel Street Project**

Temporary watermain installation in phase 1 has been completed and exploratory work on existing infrastructure will continue. Watermain construction work has successfully commenced. Lochiel Street from Munroe Avenue West to Patrick Avenue will remain closed the coming weeks while construction takes place.



## Bruce Street (County Road 20) Project

The County of Renfrew will work on 3.11 km of Bruce Street (County Road 20) from Highway 60 to Garden of Eden Road. The project will include rehabilitation by a combination of milling and paving and applying surface sealer treatment, with some drainage repairs. Lane closures and alternating traffic will be required for portions of the project. Construction is anticipated to be undertaken in July and completed early in August.

At the Council meeting on June 27th, 2023, Renfrew Town Council discussed the Ottawa Valley Business Hive, affordable housing, by-laws, biosolids management, graffiti removal, murals, community improvement grants and the Ma-te-Way

Expansion.

At the Special Council meeting on July 7th, 2023, Renfrew Town Council agreed to a 10-year lease with the Renfrew County and District Health Unit for space being renovated at Town Hall, created the Ma-te-

Way working group, awarded paving projects and engineering designs for the Highway 60 - O'Brien Road project and more.




#### **Recreational Outdoor Burn By-Law**

This is a reminder that the Town of Renfrew has an Outdoor Recreational Open Air Burning By-Law

- All recreational outdoor burning requires a fire permit to be issued by the Fire Chief. Permits can be obtained by visiting
  rf.burnpermits.com.
- No personal shall set or maintain a recreational fire except between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m.
- No person shall burn materials other than commercially produced charcoal, briquettes, or clean, dry seasoned wood free of chemicals, paint, or stain.
- Recreational fires shall be confined to commercial, non-combustible containers or to a pit no larger than 1 meter (39") in width and 460 millimeters high (18" height).
- A recreational open-air fire shall be confined to an area that is a minimum of four (4) meters from combustible structures or objects.
- An effective extinguishing agent of sufficient size and with the capability of extinguishing the fire shall be at the site of the burning and be immediately available for use.
- Recreational open-air fire shall be attended, controlled, and supervised at all times and shall be completely extinguished before the fire is left unattended.
- Any person who contravenes any provision of the by-law is guilty of an offense and is subject to a fine.
