Mural at Visitor Information Centre Complete



The new mural inside Renfrew's Visitor Information Centre is now complete. Councillor Andrew Dick, Chair of the Community Services and Economic Development Committee and Renfrew Mayor Tom Sidney joined artist Jimmy Baptist on Tuesday, March 12th, 2024, to view the progress of the mural project. Community members were invited to help paint the mural on March 5th and 6th, 2024.

The project is being led by the Town of Renfrew in partnership with Kate Monahan from The Quiet Guiding Company and Becky Wright from Milestone Consulting. The cost of this mural is included as part of the grant funding received through Heritage Canada to undertake the Community Support, Multiculturalism and Anti-Racism Initiatives Project. As a part of this project, the Town of Renfrew hosted a Cultural Exchange Event, conducted all staff training, and a three-year plan will be created to guide the Town and create awareness around anti-racism, diversity, inclusion, and accessibility.

As part of a grand unveiling, members of the community will be invited out to see the completed project. Council has also directed staff to look at options for renaming the Visitor Information Centre with a further report expected.

Tree Planting Project to Proceed in 2024



The Town of Renfrew is partnering with Ontario Power Generation (OPG) and the Scouts organization on a tree planting project. The project by the Town, OPG and Scouts will see 120 trees planted at Ma-teWay Park in 2024 with the planting tentatively scheduled for the end of May.

Amanda Springer, Manager of Environmental Services for the Town of Renfrew, says, "The Town was approached by OPG to provide public land for the planting project late in 2023 and after a few planning meetings, Ma-teWay Park was selected as the ideal location." Springer adds, "A few larger shade trees will be planted around the new play structure with many smaller trees planted along the Millenium Trail."

As part of the tree planting partnership, OPG will provide 120 trees and shrubs, the Scouts organization will help with planting and the Town of Renfrew will provide planting support, mulch, and a commitment to care for the trees after they're planted.

Strategic Organizational Restructuring at Town Hall



The Town of Renfrew is strategically restructuring the organization to improve efficiency and maximize cost savings for the community.

Part of the changes will see the Facilities, Maintenance and Operations Department merged with the Department of Library, Community and Recreation Services and the Department of Development, Environment, and Infrastructure. Acting Director Michel Asselin retired March 8th, 2024, after working 19-years with the Town of Renfrew. Acting Director Janet Collins has agreed to stay on with the Corporation on a part-time basis until December 2024 to assist with the implementation of a winter and summer maintenance operations review.

Director Eric Withers has also been appointed the Deputy CAO.

Council adopted the revised organizational chart on March 12th, 2024, through a bylaw amending the Organizational Structure Policy.

A Message from the Renfrew Fire Department



Known as the invisible killer, carbon monoxide is an invisible odorless, colourless gas created when fuels (such as gasoline, wood, coal, natural gas, propane, oil, and methane) burn incompletely. CO alarms should be installed in a central location outside each sleeping area and on every level of the home and in other locations where required by applicable laws, codes or standards.

Test CO alarms at least once a month; replace them according to the manufacturer's instructions.

If the CO alarm sounds, immediately move to a fresh air location outdoors or by an open window or door.

If you need to warm a vehicle, remove it from the garage immediately after starting it. Make sure the exhaust pipe of a running vehicle is not covered with snow.

Solar Eclipse Safety

An eclipse occurs when the light of a body outside Earth's atmosphere (Sun, Moon, planets, etc.) is temporarily blocked by another body. Eclipses don't just happen on Earth: they also take place on other planets, like Jupiter and Neptune.

To prevent serious eye damage, always avoid direct eye contact with the Sun, especially during

a solar eclipse. Use special glasses with eclipse filters, as regular sunglasses won't offer sufficient protection. Prioritize your eye health while enjoying the beautiful spectacle of a solar eclipse.

The next **total solar eclipse to be visible in Canada** will occur on April 8, 2024.

Solar Eclipse Safety

April 8, 2024 Use the advice below

As the moon aligns perfectly between Earth and the Sur., parts of Ontario will experience temporary darkness. Use the advice below to stay safe during the eclipse.

Warning!

Looking directly at the uncovered Sun without protection can cause retinal burns, blurred vision, or loss of eyesight. There are no pain sensors in your retinas to tell you that your eyes are being damaged. Once symptoms begin, the damage is usually too late to reverse.

Quick facts

- The eclipse is expected to start just after 2:00 p.m. EDT with a full eclipse from approximately 3:20 p.m. and move eastward. The specific time and duration of the eclipse will depend on your location. Areas outside the path of totality will observe a partial solar eclipse.

Historically, eclipses have prompted mass movements of people to prime viewing areas.

Travel tips

While driving, avoid looking at the eclipse. Keep your eyes on the road to safely operate your vehicle and avoid collisions.

- Follow local directives and road signage as you travel on April 8. While travelling on highways, do not stop, take pictures, or get out of your car to view the eclipse.
- 3 Stay updated on road conditions before, during, and after the eclipse by visiting <u>5110n.ca</u>.
 - Expect increases in traffic and road congestion. Plan ahead, fill your gas tank, and have snacks, water, entertainment, and first-aid supplies on hand.
 - If travelling to view the eclipse, plan to arrive at your destination 24 to 48 hours ahead of time.

Eye safety

- It is not safe to look at the Sun without eye protection. Looking at even a small sliver before or after the eclipse without eye protection can be harmful to your vision. Health impacts may include retinal burns, blurred vision, and loss of eyesight (immediate or delayed onset).
- Classes with specialized filters adhering to the ISO 12312-2 international standard can be worn to prevent eye damage. Glasses should be inspected for wrinkles or scratches ahead of use and should not be used if damaged.
- 3 If appropriate eye protection is not available, alternative viewing strategies should be considered, such as an <u>eclipse box</u> or a live stream.
