
Council Approves New Logo for Renfrew

The Town of Renfrew is rolling out a new logo and branding materials. The new branding was developed in collaboration with Syntax Strategic Marketing, whose President and CEO is from Renfrew.


The branding initiative started with a survey in July 2023, circulated to members of Council, staff, and representatives from the local business community. Based on feedback received, Syntax presented concepts to committee members in August, followed by a public survey in September.

"The changes to our visual identity will continue to enhance civic pride and create a brand that attracts visitors, new residents, employers and investors," says Reeve Peter Emon.

The official motto for the Town of Renfrew will remain "Let It Flourish", with the new slogan "Bridging Charm and Convenience."

"The new logo and branding will start to roll out in the coming months," says CAO Robert Tremblay. "The wayfinding sign concepts will be phased in over several years with feedback from the Parks and Recreation Master Plan."

The use of the revamped logo, slogan, wayfinding signage concepts and branding was endorsed by Renfrew Town Council on Tuesday, November 14th, 2023.



Renfrew Reeve Peter Emon sole nominee for 2024 County of Renfrew Warden

Town of Renfrew Reeve Peter Emon has been nominated for a second consecutive term as the Warden for the County of Renfrew. The Warden fulfils the role as head of council. During the 2024 term, the Warden intends to continue pressing ahead on key issues of importance to County Council and the residents of Renfrew County.



"It has been a pleasure and an honour to serve as Warden. My fellow councillors have been and continue to be very supportive," Warden Emon said. "They work hard, contribute ideas, passion and energy to seeking resolutions and solutions which will benefit our community."

Nominations for Warden closed on November 10, 2023, and no other members of County Council put forth their name as a candidate for the position. Warden Emon has served in municipal government for 35 years and has recently been able to dedicate more time to the job since retiring from a 40-year career as a public servant in community services. This will be his sixth term serving as Renfrew County Warden.

Ontario Making Progress to Widen Highway 17 Between Renfrew and Arnprior

The Ontario government has completed the first phase of work to widen Highway 17 from two to four lanes between the Town of Renfrew and Arnprior, with the opening of a new interchange at Calabogie Road. Work completed in Phase 1 of the project included building a new interchange to carry Calabogie Road traffic over Highway 417, a new carpool lot north of the highway, access roads and new ramp connections.

"The completion of this interchange is great news for Renfrew County and demonstrates that our government is serious about making travel easier for the 14,000 drivers who rely on this stretch of Highway 17 every day," said John Yakabuski, MPP for Renfrew-Nipissing-Pembroke.

The next phase includes building three more interchanges and widening 22.5 kilometers of Highway 17 from Scheel Drive to three kilometers west of Bruce Street

in Renfrew County.
