



New Play Structure Open at Ma-te-Way Park



The new play structure at Ma-te-Way Park in Renfrew is officially open. Through the Commemorate Canada — Reopening Fund, the Town of Renfrew received \$129,000 in grant funding to support the installation of the new play structure.

Mayor Tom Sidney says, "The Town of Renfrew is grateful for the financial support from the Government of Canada for this new park that has a number of accessible features."

In addition to features like an accessible swing, the new play structure equipment also includes a zip-line, multiple slides, monkey bars, a rock-climbing wall, a lookout tower, interactive activities for children, and more.

Councillor Jason Legris, the Chair of the Fire, Recreation and Community Services Committee, says, "This equipment will benefit our community for many years and it's wonderful to see families already out and enjoying the new play structure."

The play structure opened for the public to use on Saturday, September 9th, 2023.



Clerks Department Offering Marriage Ceremonies at Renfrew Town Hall

The Town of Renfrew Clerks Department is now offering marriage ceremonies.

Clerk Victoria Charbonneau says, "The first wedding at Town Hall took place on Friday, September 8th, 2023, and we are excited to offer this service for anyone looking to get married."

Civil ceremonies will be conducted by a Marriage Officiant of the Town of Renfrew. Couples wishing to be

married in Renfrew must have an Ontario Marriage License issued by the Town of Renfrew or another Ontario municipality.

The ceremonies take place at the Town of Renfrew municipal office located at 127 Raglan Street South in Renfrew, Ontario, and can be held Thursdays and Fridays from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. subject to the availability of the Marriage Officiant. The fee for a marriage license is \$125 for residents and \$150 for anyone who is not a resident of Renfrew. The cost to have a wedding at Renfrew Town Hall is \$250 plus taxes and that covers staff time and resources needed to facilitate the ceremony.

Two witnesses are required to be present during the ceremony and if you do not have a witness, the Town may be able to provide them for the ceremonies conducted at Town Hall. Up to 25 guests can be accommodated in the Council Chambers for marriage ceremonies and the couple is welcome to supply flowers.

Fall Hydrant Flushing

The Town of Renfrew is conducting valve turning and hydrant flushing from October 16th to October 20th, 2023. The work will take place overnight for ease of access to the valves from traffic, to not disrupt peak water usage times and to keep water discoloration issues at a lower risk. As part of the routine maintenance, the hydrants will be opened to discharge water and clear watermains. This procedure ensures that all hydrants and valves are working properly and identifies other problems that may be present. The areas that could potentially see water discoloration are:





GURBSIDE LEAF AND YARD WASTE PICK-UP

will occur the weeks of October 9th, October 23rd and November 6th.

Pick-up will occur throughout the week and may not correspond with your garbage and recycling pick-up day.

Acceptable yard waste containers include biodegradable paper bags and bound bundles that do not exceed 1.5 m (5') in length or 0.6 m (2') in diameter. Leaf and Yard waste material cannot exceed 25 mm (1") in diameter and bags or bundles cannot exceed 50 lbs. Un-bundled branches and twigs will not be collected. Please have your yard waste at the curb by 7 am on Tuesday of the pick-up week.

Surveys are to be completed by September 29th, 2023.



Notice of Public Information Centre (PIC) Town of Renfrew O'Brien Road (Highway 60) Reconstruction

INTRODUCTION

The Town of Renfrew has retained Jp2g Consultants Inc. and BT Engineering Inc. to design the reconstruction of O'Brien Road (Highway 60), from Mask Road to Wrangler Road. The project is being completed with financial contributions through the MTO's Connecting Link funding program. The improvements will be in accordance with the recommendations of the previously completed Hall Avenue Environmental Assessment (EA) Study (2015), and the Master Transportation Plan (MTP) Study (2022) which will include a roundabout at Innovation Drive/Wrangler Road/O'Brien Road intersection. The



construction is scheduled to take place in 2024, in order to comply with the requirements of MTO's funding program.

STUDY PROCESS

The roundabout at Wrangler Road/Innovation Drive/O'Brien Road (Highway 60) received environmental clearance from the Hall Avenue EA Study (2015). Projects that involve localized operational improvements and/or the construction of intersections and roundabouts within the existing right-of-way are exempt from the Municipal Class EA (2023) process. As such, formalized public consultation is not required; however, the Town is still going ahead and presenting the preliminary design to the public for comments.
